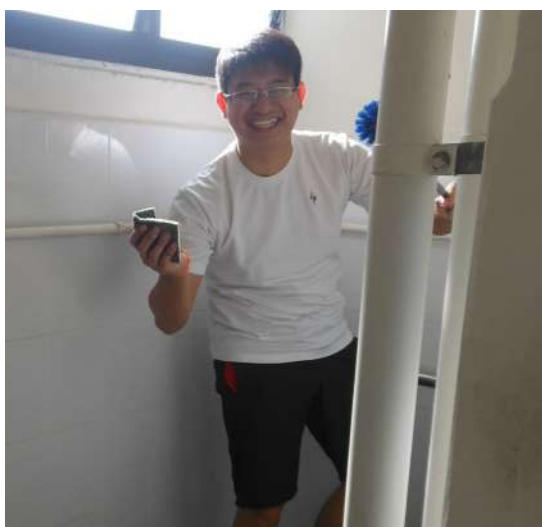
Love Our Community



Home is where the heart is

Harvest Care Center (HCC) believes strongly that Home is where the heart is. In line with the goal of transforming communities, a new initiative strikes at the heart of the matter -The Home.

HCC's new home revamp initiative was kick-started in January 2014 and targets low income families renting 2 room flats in Block 103, Aljunied Crescent. With the aim of improving the home environment for these families, HCC volunteers rolled up their sleeves and got down and dirty for a massive cleaning overhaul. The participating households underwent a transformation after being cleaned, tidied up and had broken fixtures repaired. Not only were they scrubbed spotless but beautified as the volunteers repainted rooms, kitchens, door and gates too.



Enriching the lives of others inevitably enriches our own lives as well, as the HCC volunteers discovered.

Marcus Ho, a volunteer said, "Being able to see the smiles the team has put on the faces of those receiving this gift has been the real blessing. It's always better to give. I'm sure all the volunteers had fun bonding with the residents and with one another. A family that does chores together stays together!" [S](#)

Beyond the classroom

Twelve Harvest Care Centre (HCC) volunteers took 15 children aged 6 to 11 to Chinatown Heritage Centre and Gardens by the Bay in March.

These children came from the centre's SPARKS student care programme under the financial assistance scheme; Love the Community programme's En'Rich, a subsidised tuition programme; and "Read with us" programme which is extended to children from the rental blocks at Aljunied Crescent.

At the Chinatown Heritage Centre, the children took a journey back into time to witness the harsh living conditions of migrants in Chinatown in the 1950s. Split up into four teams, they also scoured the exhibition galleries for answers to their crossword puzzle and items to their treasure hunt, racing against one another to emerge the fastest team.


At the next stop – the Adventure Trail at Gardens by the Bay, the groups were put to an obstacle course and cheered their team mates on as they balanced on beams, climbed structures, and overcame ‘spider webs’. After a McDonald’s Happy Meal lunch, the children were given free rein of the time to frolick at the Children’s Playground’s hydro vaults and splash leaves. It was the highlight of the day for them and many were reluctant to leave.

7-year-old, Fazrul Elfiyan Bin Md Azril, 6-year-old Nur Ryana Fazura and 9-year old Sachin Tan were three children who said they enjoyed the Children’s Playground the most. “We give it five out of five stars!” Fazrul said.



But it was not only the children who had a great time. The volunteers, too, said they enjoyed bonding with the children and had received more from the kids than what they had given to them.

Encouraged by the event’s success, HCC plans to organise another educational trip after the June school holidays.

Programme executive Zhang Rongzhu said: “We will continue this event as we believe that children learn through play, beyond mere textbooks. Through engaging their five senses, we believe we can enhance the students’ learning experience.” 



Learning and Reading is fun



Like most of her peers, Miss Tan Ting Fang, 18, stays out late on Friday nights. She has fun with her friends, but not in the conventional sense. Her “friends” are her tuition students, who are attending primary school.

Miss Tan is one of the mathematics tutors of en’Rich, which runs tuition and reading programmes for less privileged children. Although she has to juggle her own schoolwork and activities, Miss Tan continues to conduct the tuition sessions regularly.

“Despite having to shuttle from school to HCC every Friday, I still try my best to make it even if I was left with less than an hour with the children. My driving force would definitely be the children, as the sense of satisfaction written on [their faces] as we conquer each math problem a step at a time simply never fails to make me smile.” Miss Tan also added that she enjoyed every session very much.

Miss Kiong Xinyi, who is involved in the reading program, agreed. “The program allows kids from all walks of life to come together, interact and learn; all in a relaxed and fun environment. Knowing that I can contribute to their learning makes it purposeful.”

The reading programme currently has 9 children participating consistently, and 5 volunteers who take turns to run the reading sessions. As for the tuition programme, it is available every Friday, Saturday and Sunday for primary and secondary students, at subsidised fees ranging from \$10 to \$60 monthly for each subject.

Miss Tan and Miss Kiong hope more volunteers could join them in instilling the love of reading and learning in the children. Said Miss Kiong, “Don’t think about what you can give, just avail yourself and you’ll be amazed at how much the kids love to have someone to read to them!”

Developing Social Awareness amongst students

Famous historic leader and humanitarian Martin Luther King Jr. once said, “Intelligence is not enough. Intelligence, plus character, that is the goal of true education”. This is the very heartbeat of the educators at SPARKS who strive to ensure that each and every student is developed both in character and in academics.

In March, SPARKS together with the Singapore Police Force conducted an interactive talk on the topic of good citizenship among students. Officer Muhammad Nurhidayat Khrudin and his team arrested the attention of their audience of 30 students with tips on social awareness in the neighbourhood as well as crime prevention. The highlight for the students however, was experiencing first hand being in a police car and playing with batons and handcuffs.

“Apart from sitting in an actual police car and learning about good behaviour, my son immensely enjoyed reading the Crime Prevention handbook that was filled with comics and puzzles, which he got to keep!” raved parent, Mrs Mabel Low.

As a follow up programme, SPARKS will be leading students to a Singapore Police Force charge office in September, to further increase awareness of social justice and harmony.

To reinforce any lesson learnt in the classroom, SPARKS believes that “Getting parents involved in their children’s education will motivate children deeply and impact them not just academically, but emotionally and socially.” explained SPARKS programme executive, Ms Ng Ming Zhu.

In April this year, SPARKS invited Compass Life, a non-profit organisation focused on empowering parents on family life skills, to organise a parent-student-bonding workshop. 15 students, ages 6 to 12 years old, together with their parents benefited from the organization’s vast expertise. Parents not only learnt about various parenting styles but each family spent quality time bonding over simple activities like building a terrarium, which participants took home as a souvenir.

“Parents may not have access to resources on parenting techniques. Our goal for such programmes is to give parents useful insights as well as to facilitate tighter bonds among families, which will nurture a child’s character.” said Ms Ng. [S](#)

Serve Cambodia 2013



Since 2009, W.A.D! Club has been sending youths of various ages on service-learning journeys to Cambodia and Laos. The most recent trip from the 12th to 19th December 2013 to Cambodia was yet another filled with breakthroughs. One of the main service projects carried out was the building of walls for a Vocational Training Centre on Widows' Island in the Kandal province. As the name suggests, this island is home to a colony of widows, along with other socially undesired peoples. W.A.D! Club works with our partner NGO, Family Care Cornerstone Project (FCCP) to provide long-term sustainable development for the islanders.



With this common vision in mind, the volunteers toiled to lay thousands of bricks forming the walls of this Centre. While much more work is still needed for the Centre to be fully operational, the hard work of the volunteers will be continued and the vision materialised by another partnering team of the NGO to complete the roofing and internal furnishings. Once completed, this Centre will then serve the community as a headquarters for visiting professionals to live and teach vocational skills.

Small teams of volunteers also went out of the safe preserve of the school into villages and islanders' homes to conduct a simple survey of the poorest families. The students were conscious not just to ask questions in an interrogative manner but to also leverage the opportunity to find out more about the everyday joys and challenges of living on the island. Beyond their material needs, many of the islanders desired social acceptance the most (something denied to them by the general Cambodian society), due to their social marginalisation. These house calls then became an emotional salve to the islanders and eye-opener for students. This is service-learning, done the W.A.D! Club way, and we hope you join us on our next trip! [S](#)

室外学习

丰收关怀中心的12名义工在三月份带领了15位年龄6到11岁的孩童去参观了牛车水原貌馆与滨海湾花园。

这些儿童是来自于本中心 SPARKS辅助计划、en' Rich (资助补习课程)以及让住在出租组屋单位的儿童参与的“一起阅读”活动。

在牛车水原貌馆里，孩童们踏上回到1950年代的旅程，目睹当时居住在牛车水的移民的严酷的生活环境。他们分为四组，在展览厅内寻找他们纵横字谜游戏的答案，比赛哪一组是最快完成的。

在接下来的一站: 滨海湾花园的“冒险之旅”中, 小组们面对了跨越障碍训练场的挑战, 他们互相激励组员走上平衡木、攀上柱子、越过“蜘蛛网”。在吃完麦当劳的快乐儿童餐后, 儿童们在儿童游乐园里自由的嬉闹, 在喷水管和泼水树叶之间玩得不亦乐乎。到了该回家的时候, 他们很多仍然依依不舍。

7岁的Fazrul Elfiyan Bin Md Azril、6岁的Nur Ryana Fazura 和9岁的Sachin Tan最喜欢儿童游乐园。Fazrul 说:“我们会颁给它满分: 五个星星!”

不只是儿童, 义工们也说他们很享受与儿童们在一起的时间, 觉得从孩子们身上所收获的比他们所给予的还多。

本中心看到这次活动的成功后, 打算在六月份学校假期后再举办一次的室外学习活动。

项目主管张榕株说:“我们会继续举行这类活动, 因为我们相信孩子不只是在课堂上, 也能通过有趣的课外活动来学习。这些活动能让孩子们更加充分的使用他们的五感, 相信能提升他们的学习效果。 S



学习与阅读是充满乐趣的!

十八岁的陈婷芳小姐, 与大多数的同龄人一样, 在每周五晚上都会很晚回家。她会和“朋友”一起开心的玩乐. 但是她的“朋友”是她补习班上的小学生。

陈小姐是 en' Rich 的一名数学补习老师。en' Rich 是为经济上有困难的学生们而开办的补习和阅读课程。虽然忙于管理她的学业与校内活动, 陈小姐仍坚持定期进行这些补习课程。

“虽然每周五都需要从学校赶来丰收关怀中心, 我仍然尽最大努力出现。即使最后我只能跟学生们花少过一个小时的时间, 我还是会尽力来的。我的动力就是我的学生们, 当我跟他们一步一步克服这些数学问题, 看到他们脸上的成就感, 我就会情不自禁的微笑。”陈小姐还说她觉得每一堂课都令她感到很愉快。

在“阅读活动”帮忙的龚欣宜小姐也同意说:“我参与的这项活动让不同背景的学生们能够在一个舒适和有趣的环境里一起交流与学习。能在他们的学习中有所贡献, 这让我觉得很有意义”。

目前有9位同学参加了“阅读活动”, 并与5名义工轮流进行阅读活动。小学和中学学生的补习时间安排在每周五、六、日。根据学生家庭收入状况和津贴后, 补习费用为每月每科 \$10 到\$60。

陈小姐与龚小姐希望会有更多义工参与, 让学生们体验到学习与阅读的乐趣。龚小姐呼吁:“别在意你能给予什么, 尽力奉献自己的能力, 你会惊奇的发现孩子们是多么的喜爱能有人与他们一起阅读” S



学生服务



提高学生的社会意识

历史上著名的领导者， 马丁·路德·金 曾经说过：“单单智慧是不足够的。智慧，加上人格，这才是教育的真正目标。”这也是 SPARKS 教师们的心声，我们每一位都求确保每一个学生在品格上和学业上健康成长。

在三月份，SPARKS 与新加坡警察部门联合举行了一项互动研讨会，主题是学生如何做一个好的国民。Muhammad Nurhidayat Khrudin 长官和他的队伍让30名学生学习一些社会意识以及预防犯罪的小点子。让学生们最感兴趣的则是体验首次坐在巡逻车里的感觉，以及触摸警棍和手铐。



“除了坐在真实的警车里和学习良好的行为，我的儿子也非常喜欢阅读带有小漫画和谜题的犯罪预防手册。最后他也能把这手册带回家！” Mabel Low 女士感叹道。

为了跟进这项活动，SPARKS 将在九月份带领学生们去探访一所新加坡警方的拘留所，更进一步的增强他们社会公正与和谐意识。

SPARKS 相信，为了强化在课堂上所学的知识，“让家长们参与到他们孩子的教育中会激励他们的孩子，让他们在学业上，情绪上和社交上都受到影响”，SPARKS的 负责人黄明珠小姐解释说。

今年四月份，SPARKS 邀请了 Campus Life， 一间着重于帮助家长学习管理家庭生活技能的非盈利组织，举行了一项促进家长和孩子之间关系的互动研讨会。15名年龄在6至12岁的学生和他们的家长受到了该组织专业知识的帮助。家长学到的不仅仅是一些家庭教育方式，也通过一些简单的活动和孩子一起花时间，例如建造出一个可以带回家的玻璃容器。

黄小姐说：“父母亲们可能缺乏一些家庭教育方式的资源。我们举行这些项目的目标就是让父母亲们获取一些有用的见解，从而促进家庭成员之间的关系。从中，也能培养孩子的品格。” S

青少年节目



侍奉柬埔寨 2013



自2009年以来, W.A.D! 青少年节目都在派遣不同年龄的青年去柬埔寨和寮国当义工。最近的派遣之行是在2013年12月12-19日去柬埔寨, 而团队看到了许多突破。这次活动的一个主要项目是在Kandal 省份的“寡妇岛”上建立一所职业培训中心。就如“寡妇岛”的名字的含义一样, 这座小岛是让一群寡妇和遭社会排挤的人居住。W.A.D! 俱乐部与我们合伙的非政府组织, Family Care Cornerstone Project (FCCP), 为岛上的居民提供长期和可持续的发展。



为了这个共同的目标, 义工们用了上千块的砖块艰辛的建起了这所中心的墙壁。为了能让这所中心运作, 义工们还有更多工作需要完成。另一组非政府组织的义工会继续完成屋顶和内部的建设, 从而让我们的目标达成。中心完成过后, 它将会成为一间总部, 让到访的专业人员在里面生活与进行职业培训。

小组的义工也走出了学校舒适区, 进入居民家中进行简单的调查。义工们通过这些调查了解到居住在这座岛上的居民的挑战与喜乐。在他们的物质所需之外, 很多岛上的居民最想要的就是社会的接纳, 因为柬埔寨的社会排挤他们。

这些探访成为居民释放他们情绪的机会, 也让学生们大开眼界。这就是我们 W.A.D! 俱乐部的国外义工之旅。我们真诚希望你能够加入我们下一届的团队! [S](#)

Rainbow Programme

RAINBOWS is a peer support programme for children and adults who have experienced death, divorce, separation and abandonment in the family. RAINBOWS provides an accessible and a safe environment for one to sort through their pain and confusion, build a healthy self esteem and learn to trust again.

Leadership Camp

Our Leadership Camp is designed around the framework of Servant Leadership. Adopting the experiential approach and a strong emphasis on mentorship, every part of the camp programme is aligned to enable students discover the qualities of a Servant Leader.

Heritage Tour

Adopting the concept of a popular reality television game show, we bring students through a fun and experiential tour along with creative story telling to uncover lesser known facts of historical sites and develop a greater sense of appreciation for Singapore culture and practices.

Overseas Service Learning

Overseas Service Learning goes beyond an ordinary overseas community service trip. It is designed to expand the worldview of every participant through an immersion into the local culture as well as interaction with the locals. We aim to inculcate in participant a sense of appreciation and empathy for the under-developed country and its people. Through this trip, participant will also gain a global vision of happenings in under-developed countries and learn to cultivate a sense of social responsibility in their lives.

Service Learning Workshop

Our workshop is designed to equip and enhance every participant's ability to make the most of their service learning experiences. Our service learning model is adopted from the American service-learning model, where emphasis is given to our two-fold objectives: serving the beneficiaries and educating students who participate in service learning activities. Through this workshop, students will identify learning gaps in traditional community involvement activities and learn to plan service learning activities effectively.

W.A.D! STAR Sports

W.A.D! STAR Sports goes beyond an ordinary sport training or play session. It is designed for the purpose of character building. We help participants develop self-confidence, leadership skills and inspire them to serve. We aim to inculcate in every participant a healthy self-esteem and the ability to break out of their perceived limitations. Through this programme, students will not only learn a new sport but develop their ability for Self-love, Teamwork, Adjusting to achieve their goal and Responding correctly in unfavourable circumstances. W.A.D! Tchouk is ideal for a Time- Out Programme to engage students after school.

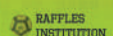
